



IT'S BEEN A BIT OVER ONE YEAR NOW SINCE WE FIRST OPENED LIMAY RIVER LODGE AND I CAN'T CEASE TO BE AMAZED.



We've had an active and exciting early season this year and there are interesting things to note. We found the quality of the resident population of rainbows and browns to be as healthy and abundant as it was last year, but there is a difference... Early in October and part of November the "Dam Administration" started releasing more water than usual which kept the river higher for a longer period of time. This stimulated many more large migratory browns to run up the Limay River system much earlier than usual. So we are happily having frequent "close encounters" with monsters more often than we did last year this time.

On the other hand, typical surface fishing with dries and nymphs has been as consistent as ever.

November was sort of windy (west wind) but the fishing was excellent and very consistent. December was very much like last year, meaning excellent, with some windy days and some non-windy, with great surface action combining very varied situations. From targeting big selective feeding rainbows sipping dries from the surface in slick slow water, to fishing structure, riffles and seams with large attractors that were violently and repeatedly attacked by browns and rainbows that ranged between 19 to 23 inches all day.



We've had some days of mild east wind as well, but that did not affect the quality of the fishing for us at all. Some guests even spent a good amount of their time on streamers of different sorts with very satisfactory success.

So right now it's like **the Limay is "the river for everybody"**. You can fish anyway you like: there's always plenty of situations to fish dries, nymphs or streamers, both on floating or sinking lines... you name it.

Yesterday was a very windy day (west wind) but everybody had a superb fishing day regardless, and the spirits were high last night. That is always so great!  
Today's evening, as I write this text, the west wind is mild... just a breeze, and I'm here, at Limay River Lodge, absolutely expecting to greet our guests coming from the river with smiles on their faces!
